ORDER
07.02.2025

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1. PIL petition concerns itself with the problem being posed in the city



on account of haphazard parking.

2. Statutory Rules namely Delhi Maintenance and Management of Parking Rules, 2019 have been framed which envisages an Apex Committee to be headed by the Transport Minister of the Government of Delhi.

3. In compliance of our order passed on 18.01.2024, a status report on behalf of Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has been filed, according to which the Corporation has prepared Parking Area Management Plans for 17 sites and two of them are also being implemented.

4. As per the requirement of the Rules 2019, the Parking Area Management Plans prepared by the Municipal bodies/local authorities are to be approved by the Apex Committee.

5. Learned counsel representing the New Delhi Municipal Corporation has also stated that process of preparation of Parking Area Management Plans at certain sites falling within their territorial jurisdiction has been initiated and is likely to be finalized soon.

6. Learned counsel representing the MCD has also stated that even after preparation of the plan, implementation of such plans at the site becomes difficult because of opposition from the general public at certain sites and for that purpose the Traffic Department also needs to be sensitised.

7. Having regard to the aforesaid facts, we call upon the learned counsel representing the Delhi Government to file a response to the status report filed by the Delhi Municipal Corporation. We also direct that wherever such plans are being implemented and the municipal body/local authority seeks any cooperation or protection from either the local police or local traffic police, the police authorities concerned shall extend their fullest cooperation so that the traffic management plans are implemented.



8. Learned counsel representing the NDMC shall also file their status report giving details of the steps which might have been taken for preparation of the plans at various sites.
9. This order shall be communicated to the Commissioner of Police, Delhi as also to the Head of the Traffic Police in Delhi by the respective learned counsel representing the parties.
