Order

1. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in spite of repeated directions given by this Court to place on record the inspection report of petitioner – college, the same has not been complied with by respondents.
2. This Court finds that it was on 26.11.2024, that learned Additional Advocate General, Mr. N.S. Rajpurohit, was directed for the first time to place the inspection report on record. Thereafter a lapse of one year on 20.11.2025, this Court again issued directions for compliance with order dated 26.11.2024 and the matter was ordered to be listed on 02.12.2025.
3. Matter was again listed on 06.12.2025 and even on that date, there was no compliance with directions issued by this Court on 26.11.2024 and 20.11.2025. However, in the interest of justice, last opportunity was granted to learned counsel for the respondents to comply with aforesaid orders.
4. Even today, orders dated 26.11.2024 and 20.11.2025 have not been complied with and further time has again sought for the same.



5. Learned counsel Mr. N.S. Rajpurohit, AAG, submits that several communications regarding orders passed by this Court have already been made to respondents; however, he seeks further time to comply with the orders passed by this Court.

6. This Court finds that the conduct of Respondent Department clearly amounts to willful and deliberate non-compliance with the orders of this Court and reflects absolute disregard and disrespect towards the same. This is not a standalone instance. In several other matters, where similar directions were issued by this Court to place on record inspection reports of institutions, respondent Department, has failed to comply with the same, which indicates flaws, non-transparency, and lack of accountability on the part of Respondent Department.

7. In view of the aforesaid state of affairs on the part of Respondent Department, the Principal Secretary, Medical & Health Department, is directed to remain present before this Court on 25.02.2026 at 2:00 p.m., either personally or through video conferencing, and shall file his personal affidavit regarding delay caused in compliance with orders passed by this Court in the present matter.

8. Personal affidavit shall be filed on or before 25.02.2026, explaining the reasons for delay in complying with the orders of this Court, as well as for not granting the NOC to petitioner – college in a timely manner.
