About **NIMLAC**

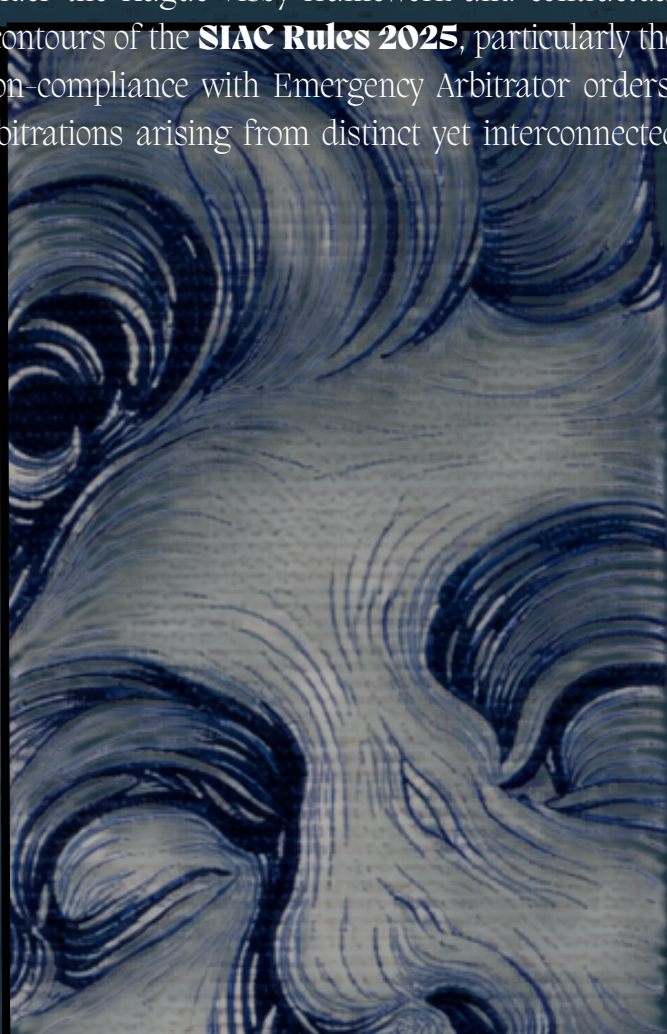
The NUALS International Maritime Law Arbitration Competition (NIMLAC) is an initiative spearheaded by the University to create an arena for student engagement with the challenging and enthralling field of Maritime Law. It is the flagship event of the National University of Advanced Legal Studies. The University, from the inception of the competition in 2014, has strived to provide to the participants, an academically enriching experience. The first edition of the Maritime Moot had the distinction of being the first of its kind in India. Since then, it has been a benchmark for all Maritime Law Moots in the country. NIMLAC has been lauded for the intricate, nuanced and contemporaneous set of issues that have formed part of the moot proposition. It has, over the years, concentrated on the practical and fundamental aspects of Maritime Law. The Competition has previously seen participation from teams across the country and abroad. It also boasts of a roster of judges who are internationally renowned jurists, members of the higher judiciary, eminent practitioners and arbitrators.



About the **PROPOSITION**

The proposition arises from a complex maritime casualty during a single international voyage of **M.V. Pragya**, where multiple consignments governed by separate Bills of Lading were affected by a fire allegedly triggered by temperature-sensitive SDID cargo following a cyclone-induced route deviation. The incident led to widespread cargo damage, emergency discharge at an intermediate port, disposal of perishable goods, and the auction of salvageable cargo despite an Emergency Arbitrator's restraint order. The consignee's insurer, proceeding by subrogation, has invoked SIAC arbitration seeking damages, enforcement of emergency relief, and consolidation of all disputes, which the carrier vigorously resists.

At its core, the proposition engages cutting-edge questions at the intersection of contemporary maritime law and modern international arbitration. It raises nuanced issues concerning a carrier's liability for fire, deviation, dangerous goods, and limitation under the Hague-Visby framework and contractual defences, while simultaneously testing the evolving contours of the **SIAC Rules 2025**, particularly the jurisdiction, enforceability, and consequences of non-compliance with Emergency Arbitrator orders, and the permissibility of consolidating multiple arbitrations arising from distinct yet interconnected contracts of carriage.



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Mayank is a specialist in maritime and technology law, with a focused expertise in autonomous shipping operations and the regulation of emerging maritime technologies. He holds an LL.M. in International Maritime Law from Swansea University (UK). He was awarded the International Excellence Scholarship (2016–17) in recognition of academic merit.

He has previously served as an Assistant Professor at O.P. Jindal Global University and is currently a Professor of Practice (Maritime and Technology Law) at D.Y. Patil University, where he is involved in teaching and curriculum development. Prior to and alongside his academic career, he practised as an Advocate with Bose & Mitra & Co., and has also worked with other law firms and appeared before various courts. He continues to engage in legal practice as an independent consultant, advising private clients and contributing to multi-stakeholder projects.
