EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE RESOLUTION

The Executive Committee of the Supreme Court Bar Association convened to consider the ongoing fast undertaken by Mr. Sonam Wangchuk. After due deliberation, the Committee adopts the following resolution:

The Committee notes with deep concern that Mr. Wangchuk has placed his health and life at risk for the future of our children, drawing national attention to the grave issues surrounding the NEET examinations and the broader well-being of the country. His longstanding work, marked by discipline, innovation, and an unwavering commitment to young learners, has transformed countless lives and stands as a model of service rooted in action, institution-building, and direct engagement with communities.

The Committee observes that through his present fast, Mr. Wangchuk has once again served the national conscience, reminding the country that moral courage is indispensable to national character. The message that emerges is clear: each of us must do our bit to strengthen the nation's moral fabric and uphold the values that sustain India's constitutional democracy.

The Committee expresses regret that despite a person of Mr. Wangchuk's integrity being willing to undertake such an extreme step for the betterment of the education system, institutional conscience has not responded with the urgency and sensitivity the moment demands. We note with deep concern a period marked by systemic failures affecting millions of young citizens and a troubling erosion of accountability across public institutions.



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The Committee acknowledges that Mr. Wangchuk's fast has stirred the nation and awakened public conscience. However, the Committee is of the considered view that India does not need him to place his life in jeopardy for a system in distress. India needs him to remain alive, active, engaged, and able to lead from the front. The long journey of strengthening institutions and restoring public faith requires his continued presence and full strength.

In recognition of the message his fast has conveyed, the Committee resolves that we too shall do our bit to build the national character, anchoring our work in constitutional morality, institutional responsibility, and the long-term interests of India's youth.

The Committee resolves to extend appropriate legal and research support, within the framework of our mandate, to initiatives aimed at ensuring transparency, fairness, and accountability in processes that determine educational opportunities.

The Committee resolves to advocate for reforms that enhance institutional integrity, and to contribute to sustained public engagement that reinforces ethical governance.

The Committee affirms that the Supreme Court Bar Association will continue to serve as a guardian of constitutional morality and institutional integrity, contributing meaningfully and consistently to the nation's long-term development.

In the spirit of these commitments, and with utmost respect for his decades of service, the Executive Committee earnestly appeals to Mr. Sonam Wangchuk to discontinue his fast, safeguard his health, and continue guiding the nation with his strength, clarity, and leadership.
