JUSTICE ANOOP KUMAR DHAND

Order

1. Mr. M.A. Khan counsel for the respondent-University submits that today, reply to the writ petition has been submitted in the Office. Learned counsel submits that multiple prayers have been made in this writ petition and detailed reply to the said prayers and the averments made in the writ petition have been submitted.
2. Learned counsel for the respondents submits that an Interpreter was provided to the petitioner, but the petitioner was insisting to be taught at her home, such service of Interpreter cannot be permitted. Learned counsel submits that the petitioner can take the help and services of the Interpreter in the College premises. Learned counsel submits that for practical examination, the Interpreter would be provided, but for theoretical examination, the assistance of the Interpreter is not required as the petitioner is not a visually impaired/blind person. Learned counsel submits that the petitioner has hearing impairment, but she can see and write



the paper after perusing the same. Learned counsel submits that an extra one hour and one extra copy would be provided at the time of taking the examination of the petitioner looking at her 100% hearing impairment disability.

3. Office is directed to tag the same for perusal of this Court.
4. Considering the arguments put forward by the counsel for the respondent-University, the following interim directions are issued to the respondent-University:-

(I) Provide one Interpreter for the purpose of assistance in studies to the petitioner till her theory examination takes place in college premises.

(II) Provide one Interpreter to the petitioner for assistance in studies for practical papers and also to assist at the time of practical examination.

(III) Provide an extra hour and one extra copy to the petitioner during the course of theory as well as practical examination.

5. It goes without saying that the paper prepared for students falling under the hearing impairment disability be provided to the petitioner for taking examination in accordance with the procedure followed by the respondent-University for the examinations of persons with disability under the category of deaf, dumb and blind person.

6. List this case on 08.07.2025. Rest of the prayers made in the writ petition would be considered at the time of disposal of the writ petition.
