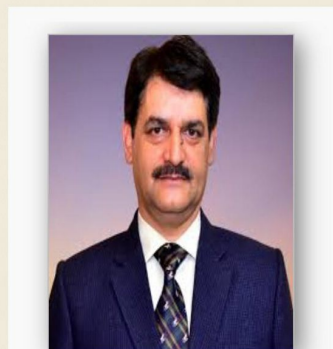

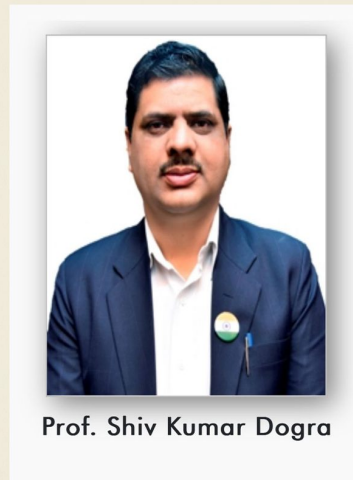

About The Competition

This is the sixth edition of Moot Court Competition in the memory of Late Sh. Thakur Kashmir Singh.

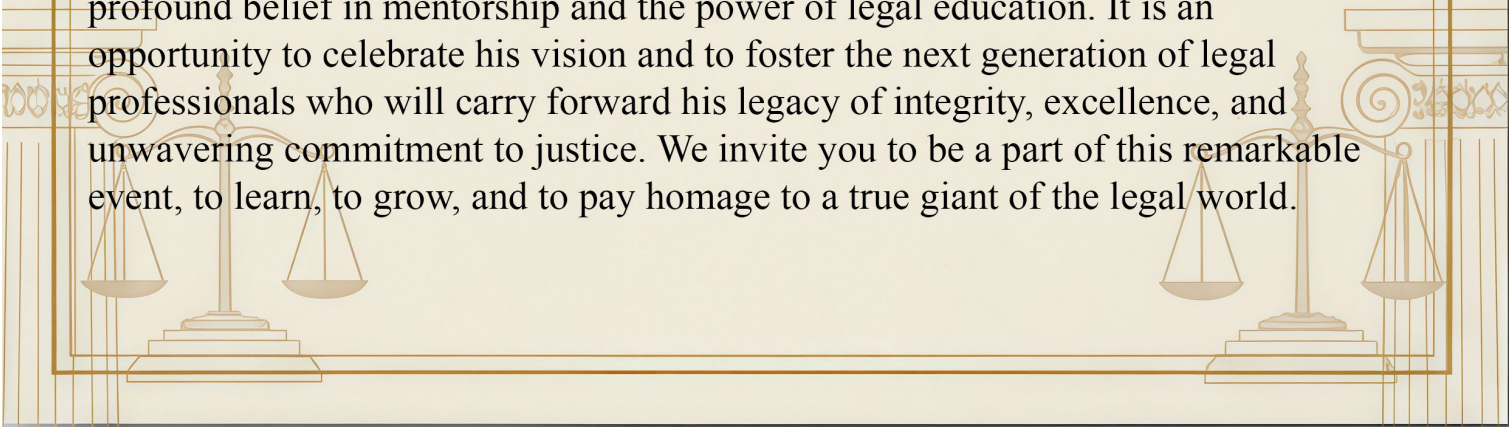
From past few years we had great participation from all over India, and we are happy to celebrate and carry this legacy of legal events conducted under his name. Late Sh. Thakur Kashmir Singh was born on 04.April.1924, enrolled in Law in Lahore but after partition the batch graduated from Law College, Chotta Shimla. In 1948 he joined Legal Profession at District Court Hoshiarpur, Punjab and from the year 1949 he shifted to UNA, Himachal Pradesh. Till his last he remained in practice attending the court, he breathed last on 11 December 2015 at the age of 92 while he was still appearing for important cases of the chamber. He established his name and fame as a Criminal Lawyer.

Under his legacy he has two Sons both of whom are Law Graduates, the Elder son did not pursue the legal profession but the younger son Sr. Adv. Sh. Naresh Thakur ji is credited for this event. He is the only Member of the Bar Council Himachal Pradesh who has a practice of over 47 years and got elected for Six Consecutive terms.

Designated as Sr. Adv. Of High Court HP in 2011, he is among the distinguished luminaries and while his name shines bright in the matters of Criminal and Constitutional matters. Appointed as Sr. Council for Central Government for 3 years in row (2002-2005). Himachal Pradesh University Institute of Legal Studies, Shimla takes immense pride in having his name, legacy and guidance attached with us from past many years.

Team Composition :

Each participating team must be composed of **three members: two speakers and one researcher.**

Any changes to the team's composition must be communicated to the organizing committee for approval. The committee reserves the right to accept or reject the proposed change at its discretion. However, such alterations will only be considered if a reasonable and satisfactory justification is provided, and they will not be permitted after the soft copy of the memorials has been submitted.

Please note that if a team member is unable to participate as per the competition rules, the entire team will face immediate disqualification from the competition.

Anonymity:

During the oral rounds, student counsels must not reveal their names. Instead, they are required to use their assigned team code for all communication and identification.

To ensure impartiality and fair play, all team members must refrain from disclosing the name of their institution at any point throughout the competition.

Additionally, scouting is strictly prohibited. Any team found to be scouting will face immediate disqualification from the competition. This rule is in place to ensure a level playing field for all participants, and failure to comply will result in an instant penalty.

Dress Code :

Participants must adhere to formal courtroom attire throughout the competition.

For Male Participants:

- Black suit with a white shirt and black tie.
- Black formal shoes

For Female Participants:

- Black suit with a white shirt OR white saree/salwar with a black blazer.
- Black formal shoes.
- Any participant failing to adhere to the dress code may be disqualified or penalized at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

Eligibility for Participation-

All students enrolled bona fide in an undergraduate course of Law i.e., 3 Yrs./ 5 Yrs. from any college or university shall be eligible for participation in the competition.

Format of the Competition-

The Competition comprises of the Following Rounds:

- ☐ Day 1 (30th October 2025) - Inaugral and Researcher's Test
- ☐ Day 2 (31st October 2025) - Preliminary Rounds - Rounds 1 & 2 and Quarter Finals
- ☐ Day 3 (1st November 2025) - Semi Finals and The Grand Finale

Finality of the decision -

The decision of the judges with regard to the outcome of the rounds shall be final. For all purposes and in any dispute, the decision of the Moot Court Committee shall be final and binding.

Authorization Letter -

Participants must submit a letter of authrization duly stamped by the head of the department of their respective institute.

Other Rules-

1. The Language of the competition shall be English only.
2. The teams shall by no means receive help from any faculty or court master.
3. During the course of the competition there shall be no use of electronic devices as such would lead to an automatic disqualification.
4. Every Team would be Assigned Teams Codes to maintain anonymity.
5. If there is any situation which is not contemplated in the rules, the organizers' decision on the same shall be final.

Registration

The teams are required to duly complete the registration by 20th October 2025 (11:59 P.M.) by filling out the google form from the link provided below.

The registration fees shall be Rs. 3500 (without accomodation).

It is upto the teams that they want to make arrangements for their accomodation themselves or they want assistance in making arrangements for them.

However we will only be helping in making arrangements and the entire cost shall be incurred by the respective teams.

The Memorial

- . Each team must prepare memorials for both sides: for the Petitioners and the Respondents.
- . The soft copies of the memorials shall be shared via email on mootcourtsocietyavalodge@gmail.com before 25th October positively.
- . Each team shall bring with them three hard copies of memorials for each side i.e. total six.
- . The cover page of the memorial, for both soft and hard copies, must clearly indicate the side it represents. Use "P" for the Petitioner's memorial and "R" for the Respondent's memorial.
- . When you submit the soft copies of your memorials, the file names must follow a specific format: your assigned team code followed by the first letter of the party you represent.
For example, if your team code is 10, the file name for the Respondent's memorial would be "10R". The file for the Petitioner's memorial would be "10P".
- . To promote sustainability, teams are encouraged to print their memorials on both sides of the paper.

Contents of the memorial

Memorials must contain not more than a total of 35 pages and the following sections should be present in the same order, as stated below-

- Cover Page;
- Table of Contents;
- Index of Authorities;
- Statement of Jurisdiction;
- Statement of Facts;
- Statement of Issues;
- Summary of Arguments;
- Arguments Advanced; (Not exceeding 20 pages)
- Prayer

The cover pages of the memorials must be printed on specific colored paper:
The Petitioner's memorial cover page should be printed on blue A4 size paper.
The Respondent's memorial cover page should be printed on red A4 size paper.

Memorial Formatting -

To ensure uniformity and readability, all parts of the memorial—excluding the cover page—must adhere to the following formatting rules:

- Main Body Text: Use Times New Roman, size 12, with 1.5-line spacing.
- Footnotes: Use Times New Roman, size 10, with single (1) line spacing.

Memorial Evaluation Criteria -

Memorials will be evaluated out of a maximum of 100 marks based on the following five criteria:

1. Knowledge of Law and Facts (30 Marks): understanding and application of legal principles and the factual matrix of the moot problem.
2. Proper and Articulate Analysis (30 Marks): ability to critically analyze the facts, construct a logical argument, and present it persuasively will be judged here.
3. Extent and Use of Research (20 Marks): breadth of your research and the effective use of legal authorities, precedents, and materials to support your arguments.
4. Clarity and Organization (10 Marks): how clearly and logically your arguments are structured
5. Grammar and Style (10 Marks): command of language, including grammar, spelling, punctuation, and overall writing style, will be assessed here.

Penalties -

- Disclosure of team identity by any means: 5 Marks
- Exceeding the page limit: 1 Mark per page
- Violation of formatting rules: 0.25 Marks per page
- Delay in submission of memorial: 1 mark per hour
- Use of any internet sources during Oral Rounds: Disqualification
- Scouting: Disqualification

Oral Rounds -

- i) Lead-in Round (Preliminary Round)**
- ii) Quarter Final**
- iii) Semi Final**
- iv) Final Round**

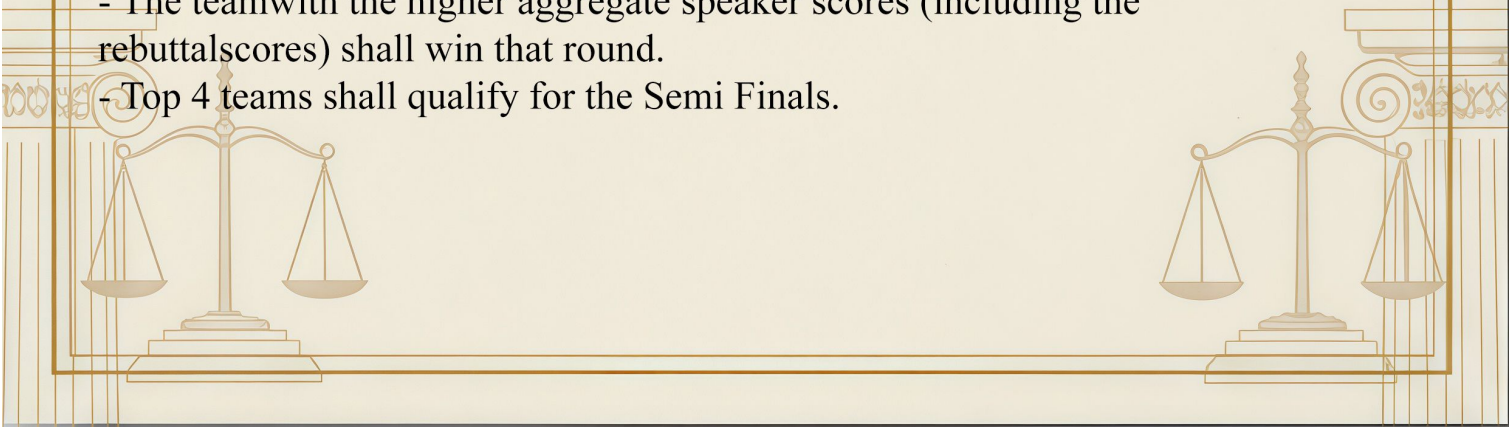
The participants shall have to prepare the case from both sides.

i) Lead-in Round

- The match up of teams shall be determined by Draw of Lots.
- Each team shall argue once from each side determined by Draw of Lots.
- Each team will get 30 minutes to present their case including 5 minutes for Rebuttal, subject to the discretion of the Judges.
- Each team shall intimate the court master in regard to division of time between speakers.
- Only one (1) speaker from each team shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.
- In the preliminary round, the team with the higher aggregate speaker scores (including the rebuttal scores) shall win that round.
- The top 8 teams shall qualify for the Quarter Final Rounds.

ii) Quarter Final

- Top Eight teams based on the result of the Lead-In Round will qualify for the Quarter Finals. The team shall argue only once in the quarter-finals. The side on behalf of which the team shall argue for the quarter-finals shall be decided by way of draw of lots prior to the Quarter Final Round.
- Each team shall get 35 minutes to present their case including 5 minutes for Rebuttal, subject to the discretion of the Judges.
- Each team shall intimate the court master in regard to division of time between speakers.
- Only one (1) speaker from each team shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.
- The team with the higher aggregate speaker scores (including the rebuttal scores) shall win that round.
- Top 4 teams shall qualify for the Semi Finals.



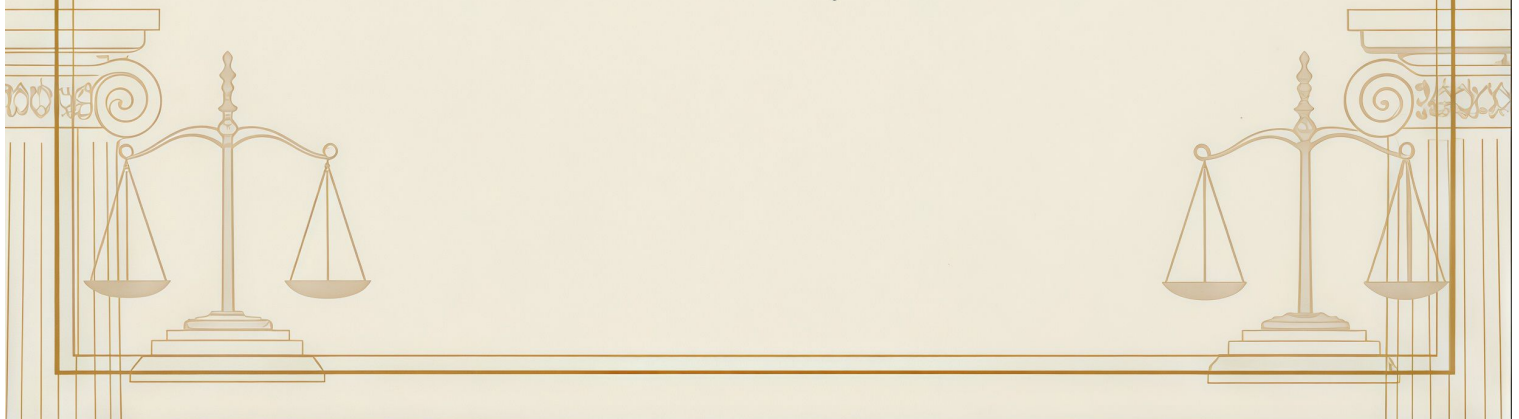
iii) Semi Final

- Top Four teams based on the result of the Quarter Final will qualify for the Semi Finals.
- The team shall argue only once in the Semi Final. The side on behalf of which the team shall argue for the Semi Final shall be decided by way of draw of lots prior to the Semi Final.
- Each team shall get 40 minutes to present their case including 5 minutes for Rebuttal, subject to the discretion of the Judges.
- Each team shall intimate the court master in regard to division of time between speakers.
- Only one (1) speaker from each team shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.
- The team with the higher aggregate speaker scores (including the rebuttal scores) shall win that round.
- Top 2 teams shall qualify for the Final Round.

iv) Final Round

- Top Two teams based on the result of the Semi Final Round shall qualify for Finals.
- Each Team shall get 45 minutes to present their case and 10 minutes shall be given for rebuttal, subject to discretion of the Judges.
- The Final Round shall consist of Constitutional Bench.
- Each team shall intimate the court master in regard to division of time between speakers.
- Both Speakers shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.

***NOTE - The rules stated above are subject to revision or alteration by the Moot Court Committee as deemed necessary.**



ORAL ARGUMENT SCORING -

The highest possible score for each speaker is 100 points.

Legal Knowledge-----20 marks

Factual Application-----20 marks

Ability to Answer & Originality-----20 marks

Poise & Courtesy-----20 marks

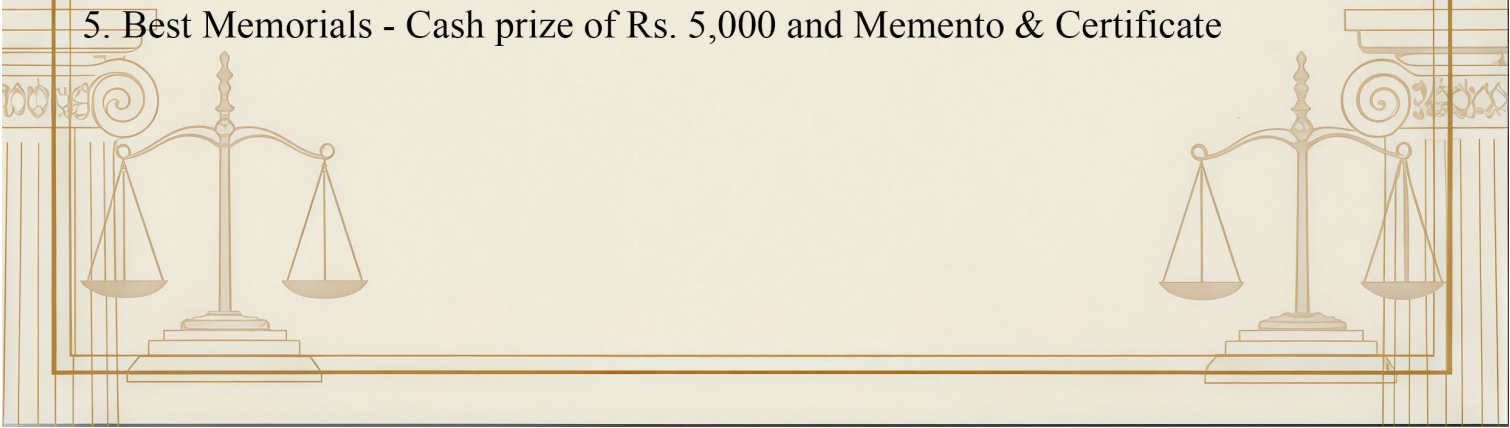
Time Discipline-----10 marks

Organization of Arguments-----10 marks

The researcher must remain seated with their team's speakers throughout the oral arguments. The researcher is not allowed to speak or engage with the judges at any point.

Moot Proposition

1. Bruce is a resident of Awadh, State of Gothampur. He is a student studying law at Awadh University, a renowned University in Gothampur offering diverse courses. He is an active member of the student political body known as Student United Front of Gothampur (SUFG) and has been elected as its President in the recently conducted elections. Robin, who is a resident of Kashmirpur, a State of Gothampur, and is actively involved in the University politics, has been elected as its Vice President. He is also an active member of Kashmirpur Azadi Sangh (KAS), a youth organisation formed in 1948, professing the ideology that Kashmirpur should not be an integral part of Gothampur and should be separated as an independent sovereign state.

2. A cultural evening was organised by the Cultural Committee of the University, in which Various competitions were held, including a debate competition. In view of the atrocities taking place across the country against the Dalit community, Bruce and Robin, on the eve of an event gathered around 3000 students and started giving a speech on the atrocities against the Dalits blamed the present Government for the same.

3. Bruce, in his speech, said, "We've elected a Government full of donkeys and they won't do anything to protect us. All the leaders are corrupt and are interested only in filling their pockets rather than working for the people. All these government leaders should be shot publicly." He got a massive response and as a result, the next day, Bruce, with his four friends, namely Anindya, Raghav, Robin and Sukarma, decided to conduct a rally on a larger scale, and almost ten thousand people, including the students of Awadh University, participated in the rally, which culminated near the Vidhan Sabha. They shouted slogans like "Azadi Chaiye Punjivad Se, Brahmanvad Se, Azadi Chaiye Bhrashtachar Se, Bhukmari Se, Azadi Hmara Haq Hai Ham Lekar Rahenge. Nahi Milegi Azadi jab tak ye Sarkar hai."

On the spur of the moment, even Robin stood up and shouted slogans for a free Kashmirpur, like "Kashmirpur ki Azadi tak, Jang rahegi jari" and ran to one student who was holding Gothampur National flag, lowered it down and unfurled the flag of Korastan, although Bruce immediately handled the situation and took the flag from his hand, but News Channels covered it and constantly displayed the same. Bruce mentioned in his speech, "We should revolt against the Government and destroy their fake policies until full attention is given to our community & our security is guaranteed, otherwise we will wage war against this Government." He also said that, "Reservation policies for our community are less than what we actually require for appropriate representation in all the fields. The government should increase the reservation govement is doing nothing, and we are treated like second-class citizens.

Thus, we should boycott all the policies and choose our leaders wisely next time."

4. Bruce did not stop here, and the next day, with the help of his friend Clark, who is a student of Awadh University and also a cartoonist in Times of Gothampur, printed a cartoon allegedly degrading the image of the Prime Minister, Parliament and the National Flag of Gothampur. After the copies of Times of Gothampur were sold the next day, Krantikari Yuva Morcha, the youth wing of the Krantikari Janta Party, which is the ruling party, started protesting in front of the Vidhan Sabha and shouted that SUFG is an anti-national organisation, and such a student body should be banned. Due to wide media coverage, this issue gained a lot of publicity and led to social disorder as students came out on the roads.

5. Police lodged an FIR due to public unrest against Bruce, Robin and their three other friends and slapped charges against them under Sections 152, 147, 61(2), 3(5), 193, 197 of Gothampur Nyaya Sanhitha and also Section 2 of the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971. One separate FIR was also filed against Clark, charging him under Sections 356 and 152 of the GNS and also Section 2 of The Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971. Soon, the police reached the Awadh University tried to arrest Bruce, Robin and their three friends, but weren't allowed to enter the campus by the student political body, and there was a clash between both sides. Students started shouting slogans against the Government and made allegations that it is trying to suppress the voices of the students belonging to the lower caste. Thereafter, the police conducted a lathi charge to disperse and control the unruly mob and arrested Bruce, Robin, Clark and three other accused. They were subsequently released on conditional bail, and criminal proceedings against them are still pending. A ban has also been imposed on The Times of Gothampur on publishing such cartoons. The ban gave rise to major unrest in the media against the Government. However, SUFG is continuously conducting student rallies in order to defend their freedom of speech and expression.

6. The case came for hearing before the Sessions Court, but due to wide media coverage and public outrage, the High Court of Awadh took cognizance of the matter and heard the case. The High Court of Awadh decided the case in favour of the state, and held that the law under Section 152 of the GNS puts reasonable restrictions on the freedom of speech and expression and also held that the petitioners were involved in Acts endangering the sovereignty, unity and integrity of the nation and also upheld the charges against them. The High Court also ordered the continuation of the ban on Times of Gothampur against the publication of such cartoons. After this decision of the High Court, the petitioners were again arrested by police.

7. One public-spirited advocate agreed to represent the students' body, SUFG, and filed an appeal in the Supreme Court of Gothampur against the order of the Awadh High Court challenging the arrest of Bruce, Robin, Clark and three others claiming violation of their fundamental rights guaranteed under Articles 14, 19, and 21 of the Constitution of Gothampur and also challenging the constitutionality of Section 152 of the GNS, arguing that it puts unreasonable restrictions on the fundamental right to freedom of speech and expression enshrined in Article 19(1)(a). In appeal, the ban against Times of Gothampur is also challenged for it being violative of the freedom of the Press flowing from the aforesaid freedom.

8. The Hon'ble Chief Justice of Gothampur constituted a constitutional bench to adjudicate on the following issues:

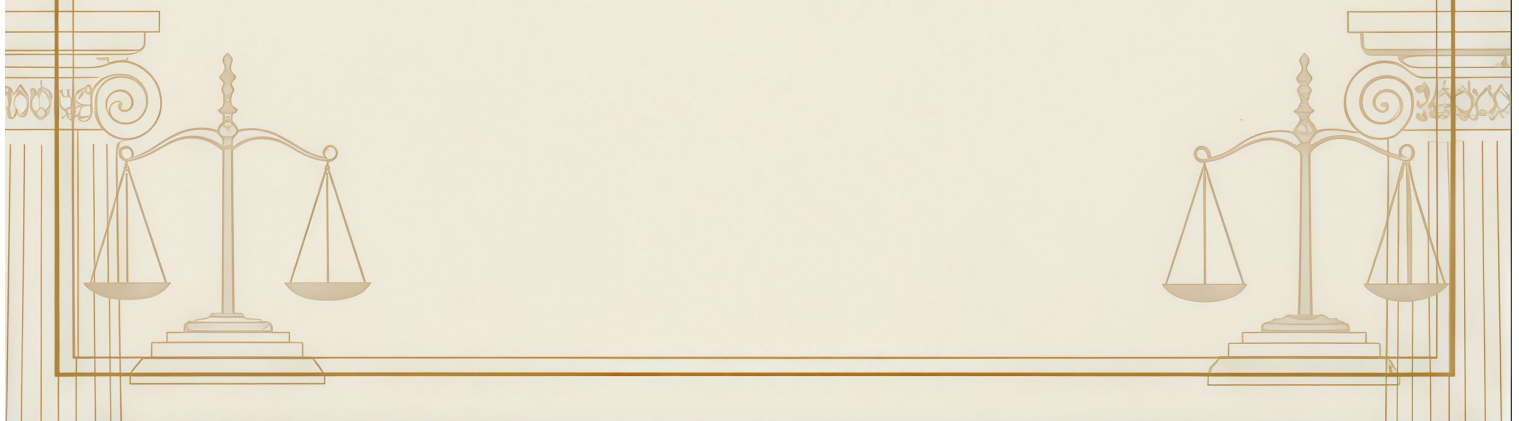
(A) Whether Section 152 of the Gothampur Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 is violative of the fundamental right to freedom of speech and expression guaranteed under Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution of India?

(B) Whether the restrictions imposed by Section 152 of the GNS are "reasonable restrictions" under Article 19(2) of the Constitution, given the broad and ambiguous nature of terms like "subversive activities" and "endangering sovereignty, unity, and integrity" ?

(C) Whether the state's action in restraining the media from reporting on the matter is an unreasonable restriction on the freedom of the press, which is an integral part of the freedom of speech and expression under Article 19(1)(a)?

(D) Whether the prosecution has sufficiently demonstrated the requisite intention (mens rea) on the part of the accused to excite or attempt to excite secession, armed rebellion, or subversive activities, as required by the section .?

(E) Whether the "potentiality of abuse" of a provision like Section 152 is a valid ground for a court to declare a law unconstitutional?



9. The Hon'ble Apex Court has requested the presence of the Ld. Attorney General for Gothampur, along with the Ld. Solicitor General, to be able to take this Constitutional Bench upon the submissions advanced by the Petitioner and submit their counter submissions thereof, furthermore directing both the parties to be ready with their final arguments by filing their written submissions before the Hon'ble Court and exchanging the copy of pleadings amongst themselves to the next date of hearing.

. The Participants should strictly adhere to the above-mentioned issues enumerated in the present moot propositions. However, participants can add sub-issues to the above-mentioned issues, as the case may be.

. The Laws of the Union of Gothampur are in Pari Materia with those of the Union of India and must be interpreted in its true sense and spirit.

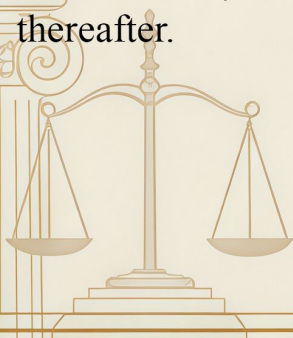
. The events and the characters depicted in the moot court proposition are purely a work of fiction and hypothetical. Any similarity to actual persons, living or dead, is purely coincidental.
