	The petitioner has sought for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus to direct the respondents to consider the representations and not to proceed to sudden deportation of minor daughters, viz., Ms.Prema Sai Kutina and Ms. Ama Kutina from India to any other Country. The petitioner has sought for other reliefs as well. The petitioner had moved the petition and made a submission that in light of sudden deportation, the relief sought for in the present petition would be rendered infructuous and accordingly, has sought for passing of necessary interim order. Sri Arvind Kamath, learned Additional Solicitor General of India appearing for respondent Union of India as well as respondent No.3 upon instructions submits that Ms.Ama Kutina has no records evidencing her birth or possess any travel documents. It is submitted that in light of non-possession of travel documents, for the present, the apprehension of petitioner regarding deportation is not a reasonable apprehension. It is submitted that the question of deportation would be considered only after any stand is taken regarding travel documents of Ms. Ama Kutina. Taking note of the same, the respondents are granted time to take their stand in writing within a period of two weeks. Re-list the matter on 18.08.2025. Needless to state that, if there is any proposal for deportation before the next date of hearing, the respondents are at liberty to move the Court.
