The GNLU-CPIL Magazine inviting submissions from experts, working professionals, academics and students. The Magazine accepts submissions in the nature of Articles, Case Comments, Legislative Comments and Book Reviews falling within the scope of Public or Private International Law.

SUBMISSION

Submit manuscripts before 11:59 PM on 31st March, 2025 in order to be eligible for publication in Volume I Issue I.

Submissions can be made via email to the CPIL Magazine editorial team at cpil@gnlu.ac.in. The email should contain the manuscript in .doc or .docx format. The body of the email should include details of the author(s), including their name(s), affiliations, academic qualifications, and contact details.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

1. Submissions should align with the themes of public or private international law, human rights law, humanitarian law, foreign policy.
3. Submissions should be between 3000 and 3500 words. Longer or shorter articles may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
4. Co-author (total of two authors) submissions are permitted
6. The article should be an original work of the author and not under consideration for publication in any other journal or blog. The work should not be plagiarised. Any form of plagiarism will lead to disqualification for publication on the Blog.
7. Manuscript should not contain any reference to the author, including their names and institutional affiliations. Anonymity to the identity of the author must be maintained uniformly throughout the content of the article.
8. Authorities should be duly cited in the article. Citations in OSCOLA 4th edition should be followed. No hyperlinks are allowed.
9. The authors shall receive an acknowledgement email on the receipt of the article by the Editorial Board. Once the Editorial Board acknowledges the receipt of an article, it will go through a rigorous editorial process and the decision about its acceptance or rejection shall be communicated to the authors.

Any failure to adhere to the guidelines may result in summary rejection of the submission.

FORMATTING GUIDELINES

- Body: Garamond with a font size of 12 and line spacing of 1.5.
- Footnotes: Garamond with a font size of 10 and line spacing of 1.
- Citations: OSCOLA, 4th edition should be followed. No hyperlinks are allowed.
- Anonymity: The manuscript should not contain any reference to the author, including their names and institutional affiliations.
- Plagiarism: Articles displaying high levels of plagiarism are liable for summary rejection.

The CPIL Magazine accepts submissions on a rolling basis. If the submission is made after the commencement of the editorial process of a given issue on the date prescribed below, the articles shall be considered for publication in subsequent issues.

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REVIEW PROCESS

The CPIL Magazine follows a blind review process. Therefore, submissions containing references to the identity of the authors within the manuscript are liable for rejection. Authors must provide their personal details only in the body of the submission email.

The review process for each issue typically takes six to eight weeks after the submission deadline. While the Editorial Board strives to maintain a consistent publication schedule, delays may occur due to unforeseen circumstances. In such cases, the Board will inform authors in a timely manner, and their cooperation will be highly valued. The Magazine reserves the right not to disclose the reasons for acceptance or rejection of any submission. Additionally, manuscripts under review must not be submitted to another publication until the editorial process is complete.

Once accepted, the manuscript becomes part of the CPIL Magazine's intellectual property. If a submission includes citations from unpublished research, it is assumed that the author(s) have obtained the necessary permissions from the original authors. Any liability arising from such citations shall rest solely with the author(s), and the CPIL Magazine assumes no responsibility in this regard.

To uphold these standards, the Magazine employs strict editorial safeguards to ensure that no plagiarized content is published.
