Writ petition (civil) praying inter alia that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed along with the WP(C) the High Court be pleased to

i. Direct the Respondents to process the certification application of the film 'JSK v State of Kerala' and communicate the decision within a period specified by this Hon'ble court,

ii. Direct the petitioners to issue show cause notice to the petitioner for the cuts submission and

iii. Pass such other interim orders as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit.

This petition coming on for admission upon perusing the petition and the affidavit filed in support of WP(C) and upon hearing the arguments of M/S ANAND B. MENON, HARIS BEERAN, AZHAR ASSEES & NABIL KHADER Advocates for the petitioners, STANDING COUNSEL FOR R1 and R2 and of SMT. O. M. SHALINA, Deputy Solicitor General OF INDIA for R3, the court passed the following:

ORDER

W.P.(C) No.23326/2025 has been filed by M/s.Cosmos

Entertainments seeking the following relief:-

“Issue a writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ, order or direction directing the respondents to forthwith process and issue the censor certificate for the Malayalam film ‘JSK v. State of Kerala’, submitted by the petitioner, in accordance with law and within a time-bound manner as deemed fit by this Hon’ble Court.”

2. W.P.(C) No.24256/2025 has been filed by the same petitioner seeking the following reliefs:-

“(i) Issue a writ of certiorari or any other appropriate writ, order or direction calling for the records leading to the issuance of the letter dated 27.06.2025 issued by the 1st respondent (Ext.P4), and quash the same as arbitrary, illegal, and violative of the petitioner’s fundamental rights guaranteed under Articles 14 and 19(1)(a) of the Constitution of India;

(ii) Issue a writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ, order or direction directing the respondents to forthwith issue the UA Censor certificate for public exhibition of the Petitioner’s feature film titled “JSK – Janaki v/s State of Kerala” under the Cinematograph Act, 1952 without insisting on any modification or deletion of the name “Janaki” from the title or dialogues of the film within a date specified by this Hon’ble court;

iii. Declare that the direction issued by the 1st respondent to change the name “Janaki” from the title and dialogues of the petitioner’s film is violative of the petitioner’s right to freedom of speech and expression under Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution of India.”

3. After arguing the matter at considerable length, counsel appearing for the Central Board of Film Certification submitted that to bring a quietus to the issue, while protecting the larger interest, a minimum excision / modification can be made to the movie as follows:-

(i) A slight modification has to be made to the subtitle of the movie by changing it as ‘JSK-Janaki V. v/s State of Kerala’.

(ii) The word / sound “Janaki” appearing in the film at time duration from 01.06.45 to 01.08.32 will have to be muted or substituted accordingly.

(iii) The word ‘Janaki’ in the film at time duration from 01.08.33 to 01.08.36 will also have to be muted / substituted appropriately.

4. Standing Counsel for the Central Board of Film Certification further submitted that if these changes are made and the edited version is resubmitted, they will endeavour to issue the Certificate to the petitioner within a further period of three days.

5. The petitioner is amenable and agreeable to the said proposal.

6. In the circumstances, the petitioner is directed to submit the revised / modified version of the movie as suggested above at the earliest. There will be a further direction to the Central Board of Film Certification to issue the Censor Certificate within a further period of three days.
