[1] Heard Mr. Anand Grover, learned counsel assisted by Ms. Achui Kamei, learned counsel for the petitioner.

[2] The petitioner approached this Court with multiple prayers for registration of FIR, grant of prosecution sanction, investigation by the SIT and compensation to the injured persons.

[3] At this stage, this Court is issuing notice to prayer No. (e) i.e. prayer for compensation to the victims.

[4] Mr. S. Niranjana, learned G.A. appearing along with Mr. Lenin Hijam, learned A.G. accepts notice on behalf of respondent Nos. 1 to 3, Mr. BR. Sharma, learned CGC on behalf of respondent No. 4 and Mr. K. Manganglemba, learned counsel on behalf of respondent Nos. 5 & 6.

[5] Mr. Lenin Hijam, learned A.G., suggests that at this stage, notice to respondent Nos. 7 to 9 who are impleaded on personnel capacity and who are personnel of the CRPF, may not be issued at this stage as it will affect morale of other security forces in discharging duties in the present situation in Manipur.

[6] Mr. BR. Sharma, learned CGC appearing on behalf of respondent No. 4 (i.e. CRPF), submits that he may be permitted to take instruction for filing appropriate application for deleting individual personnel included in the present writ petition and only the official respondent may be permitted to contest the case, if any.

[7] Mr. Anand Grover, learned senior counsel for the petitioner, fairly concedes that this Court may pass appropriate order in view of the submissions of learned A.G. and CGC.

[8] Considering the submissions made at the bar, notice to respondent Nos. 7 to 9 is deferred. Official respondents are permitted to file counter affidavit within three weeks and rejoinder affidavit, if any, within two weeks.
