1. Allowed, subject to all just exceptions.

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2. The applicant has filed the present application, *inter alia*, praying that interim bail granted to the applicant be extended for a period of forty-five days.

3. Mr Mathur, learned senior counsel appearing for the applicant submits that the applicant was granted interim bail on medical grounds in terms of the order dated 03.12.2020. He submits that the medical condition of the

applicant continues to be dismal. As noted in the order dated 03.12.2020, the applicant is at a risk of complications because of co-morbidities.

4. The interim bail granted to the applicant was not extended by the CMM or the ASJ.

5. It is not disputed that the interim bail granted to various prisoners is now being uniformly extended.

6. Considering the medical condition of the applicant, this court considers it apposite to allow the present application and extend the interim bail granted to the applicant till 21.01.2021 on the same terms and conditions as set out in the order dated 03.12.2020 passed by the learned CMM.
