The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking a direction to the respondents authorities to deliver Vikram Award 2023 to her. The interim prayer in the instant writ petition is also for issuances of an ad-interim writ directing respondents to include the name of the petitioner in Vikram Award List 2023.

Learned senior counsel appearing for petitioner has relied upon the various Clauses of Puraskar Niyam 2021 including Rule 9, sub-rule (2) clause (iii) to contend that the grant of award is to be made on the basis of priority (who has mounted earlier) and the case of the petitioner herein is that she had climbed the mountain at the earlier point of time.

Shri Swapnil Ganguli, Deputy Advocate General appears on advance instructions on behalf of the State and submits that the consideration of the eligible candidates including the petitioner has been done by a duly constituted committee and one Kumari Bhavna Dehariya has been selected for the grant of Vikram Award 2023. Neither the selection of Bhavna Dehariya is under challenge nor she has been impleaded as party respondent.

However, he prays for time to file reply in the matter.

At this stage, learned senior counsel appearing for petitioner seeks leave of this Court to represent the respondent No.1 for reconsideration of the case of the petitioner.

In view of the above, it is open for the petitioner to represent her claim before the respondent No.1 raising all grounds and it shall be open for the respondent No.1 to consider the same in accordance with law.

The reply in the matter may be filed within a period of two weeks.

List the matter immediately thereafter.
